**CHARENDOFF, Dr. Leo** Dr. Leo Charendoff, 75, of Manchester, and Boynton Beach, FL., passed away on Thursday, (December 14, 2006) at Manchester Memorial Hospital. He was born in Toronto, Canada on June 15, 1931. He was married to Elaine Levitz Charendoff for 48 years and was the son of the late Samuel and Minnie Charendoff of Toronto. A graduate of the University of Toronto and its medical school, he completed his internship and residencies at hospitals in Toronto, Boston and New York, and started his Urology practice in Manchester in 1962. At Manchester Memorial Hospital, he was formerly Chief of Urology, Chief of Surgery, and Chief of Staff. He was also on the urological staff of Rockville General Hospital. Leo was a talented surgeon who improved and extended the lives of countless patients and who mentored numerous physicians and staff throughout his distinguished career. As a young man, he served as a Surgeon Sub-Lieutenant in the Royal Canadian Navy. Among his many interests, he was an instrument rated pilot, an accomplished sailor, an expert photographer, an ardent bridge and Scrabble player, an enthusiastic golfer and a creative do-it-yourselfer, especially at the family cottage. He enjoyed 40 wonderful summers with his loving family and friends on Lake Muskoka in Ontario, Canada. His talent, his brilliance and his companionship will be greatly missed. He is survived by his wife Elaine, sons Bruce, Pamela Dempsey, of Washington, DC., and Steven of Philadelphia, PA., daughter Pamela, Dr. Jonathan Primack, of Wyomissing, PA., and eight adored grandchildren: Sally, Caroline, Cecelia, Olivia, Jonathan, Ila, Andrew and Benjamin, who in turn adored their "Bebop." He is also survived by his brother Dr. Melvin Charendoff of Toronto, sisters-in-law Evelyn Charendoff, Janet Charendoff and Ilona Levitz, and brother-in-law Martin Levitz. His brother Morrie Charendoff predeceased him. He is also survived by many loving family members in both the United States and Canada.
