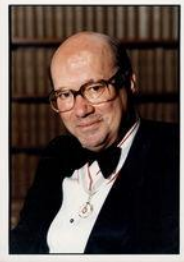


ROLLS, Ronald Joseph [UNTD STAR '51 U-64350] (1932 - 2012) Age: 79



Rolls, Ronald Joseph B.A., L.L.B., Q.C., L.S.M.

After a prolonged illness, litigator, teacher and author Ronald J. Rolls passed away in Burlington on August 14, 2012 in his 80th year. The son of the late Stanley and Alma Rolls of Hamilton. He is survived by his sister Betty Simpson, brother in law Paul Simpson, niece Debra Simpson (Wayne), nephew Mark Simpson (Tina), grand niece Nadia Simpson, and several cousins. The recipient of numerous scholarships throughout his academic career, he attended McMaster University and Osgoode Hall; graduating on the Dean's Honors List from both institutions. Mr. Rolls was called to The Bar in Ontario, with honors, in 1958, and The Bar of The Northwest Territories in 1972. He specialized in Civil Litigation. He was a retired partner and Counsel to the law firm of Fasken Martineau, in their Toronto office. In recognition of his litigation skills and many years of outstanding and varied contributions to the legal profession in the Province of Ontario, he received The Law Society Medal in 1988. A Private family Service of Remembrance will be held at St. Matthew on the Plains Anglican Church, Burlington. Mr. Roll's has been interred alongside his parents, grandparents, and great grandparents in Hamilton Cemetery. In lieu of flowers a donation to the Scholarship in the name of Ronald J.
