FROM THE COMMANDANT: CAPTAIN(N)(R) R.F. CHOAT, OMM, CD

1983 will be my final year as the Commandant of the Naval Reserve Training Centre - a position I have held with great satisfaction since 1977. All good things must come to an end, and in the words of a noted poet "The old order changeth yielding place to new, and God fulfils himself in many ways lest one good custom shall corrupt the earth." I do not believe I have corrupted the Naval Reserve, nor even the Naval Reserve Training Centre, but the time has come for change.

I have seen many young officers progress from BOC through MARS V and C of C Part 1 or Logistics or NCS and then return to fill staff positions in our Camp Slate. It has been of immense personal satisfaction to see people through the system from start to finish, to develop from youthful Cadets to mature, knowledgeable Lieutenants, and even from Cadet to Gate Vessel Command qualified. There have been many, many other areas of great satisfaction, not the least of which has been to associate and get to know so many of Canada's young people from Coast to Coast and to remind me of their enthusiasm, intelligence, dedication and just plain likeability. A personal recognition of your people's efforts on your behalf I also believe to be an essential ingredient in the mix of things that emerge and that we eventually call leadership. And it is in the leadership you provide your people that you will succeed with or fail in both your Reserve or Civil career.



I, and we, have been most fortunate in the Staff that has been put together each year to provide the services and to conduct your training. We have had a wealth of experience, dedication and enthusiasm, but many would not have returned nor given of their time if you, the students, had not been worthy of their efforts. The reward of teaching people such as yourselves has been a magnet drawing people back. Had you not shown yourselves to be so willing and capable I would not have been able to have so many return each year.

We have also seen many changes; a far more formalised training right from the initial BOC through to MARS V. The BOC and MARS II are now very reasonable and manageable courses. The MARS III, IV and V despite everyones best efforts will never be the course one would hope for until we obtain better vehicles in which to do our sea training. They will come; but not in my time at NRTC.

I thank you for having allowed me, at my age, to have been such an integral part of your essentially youthful programme. By permitting me to associate with you, you have, I am sure, kept me years younger than my actual calendar age. It is a period of my life that I shall not soon forget.

To sum up some 41 years Regular and Reserve service I can state quite sincerely that our people became ever better and that our Government deserves them ever less.

Good luck to all of you, past and present, in all your future endeavours within the Naval Reserve or without.

An Introduction:

As they settle down to studying the "nuts and bolts" of their particular classification and venture forth on the waves again, be it in DDE's, whalers, gate vessels, or HMCS Oriole, they wish the other divisions (and themselves) God speed.

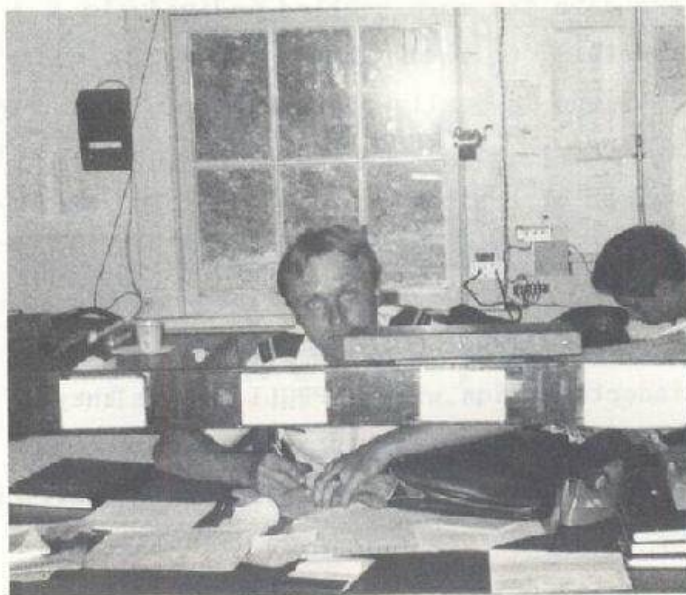

if and when the time comes to die he will be here to die with us." I think leadership is summed up very well in this story and that is where the essence of leadership lies. To be a good leader means the sacrifice of yourself for your men.

As we progress through the military system we get glimpses of professional officers and leaders as we progress. We never have the whole picture though, and we must strive to be better leaders over time, military or otherwise. Our leadership qualities are reflected in our home-lives and our faith as well as our military lives.

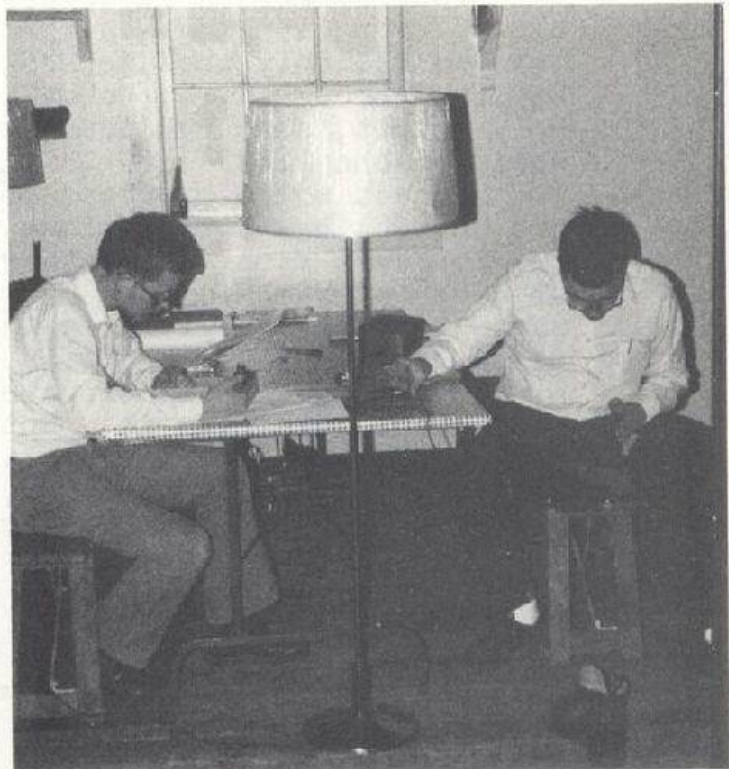

Sermonette:

TO OVERCOME FEAR

We've learned that the greatest enemy of the trained service person is fear, or more precisely, panic. Panic results when we allow the reasonable instinct of fear in a life-threatening situation to get the better of us. This morning, I want to call our attention to how the service person, and the Christian, may come to terms with fear.

Fear in the service person has to be dealt with in two ways:

1. The service person must have an understanding and faith in the competence and mutual support of his superiors and comrades.
2. He must commit himself to some action which will either deal directly with the cause of his fear, or simply serve to keep him occupied and productive until he is brought face to face with source of his fear.

Both of these principles are used by military leaders to overcome fear and panic. Both are necessary working principles for all of us.

The Christian faith affirms these principles, but it also goes beyond them. To explain briefly how it does go beyond them, I'll use Mike Cardinal's analogy of whaler pulling or sailing through life.

You may regard me as weak for saying this, but I would be whaler pulling my way through this course and life if I were to use only the two working principles mentioned. Sailing through life, to me, is to live by the power of the Holy Spirit, sent by Jesus, who said "I have overcome the world" (John 16:33)

If you would overcome fear in a deeper way, come to the One who has overcome the world and the worst it can put in one's path. Through repentance and faith in Christ, we come to have His Holy Spirit. And, as the scripture says "God has not given us the spirit of fear, but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind." (1 Timothy 1:7)

I cannot say that I have arrived, nor can any other Christian. Far from it. But any one who begins to trust in Christ shall, little by little, be able to say with the Psalmist, "I sought the Lord, and He heard me, and delivered me from all my fears." (Psalm 34:4)

UVIC and civilization was welcomed relief. At the beach on the weekends, in the common rooms to watch First Choice on weekday nights. Relaxing.

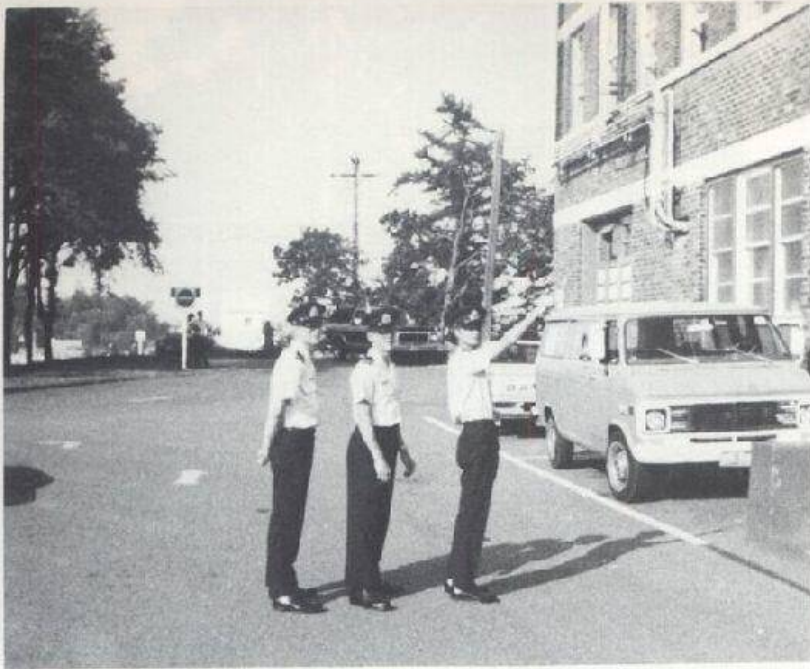
Small boats course: no one drowned but we were tempted.

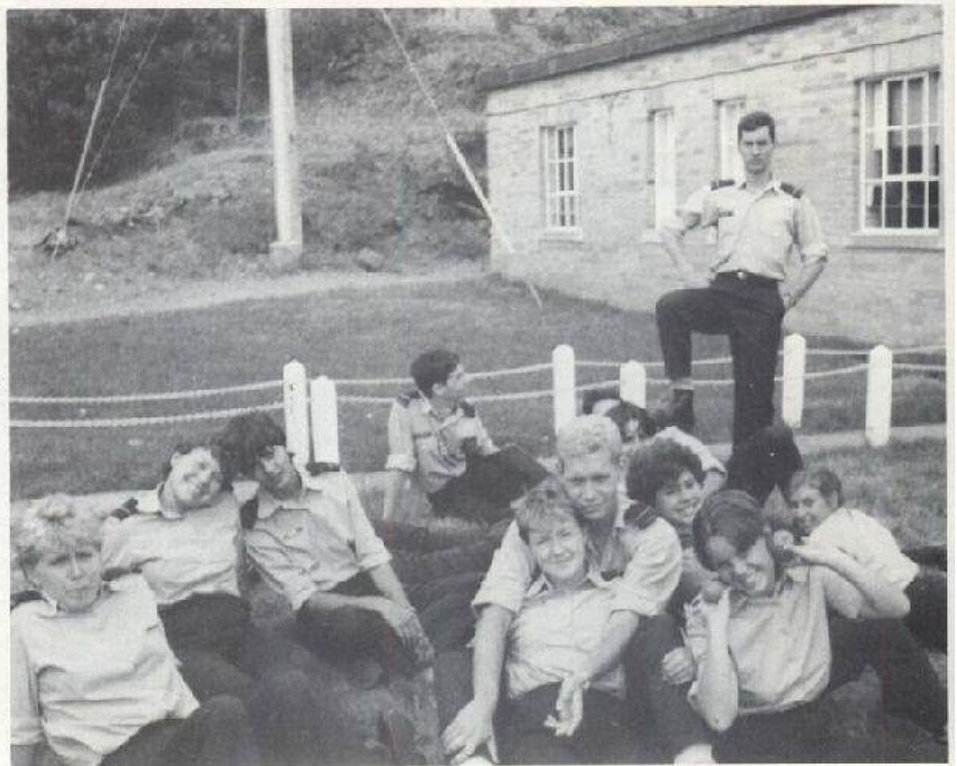

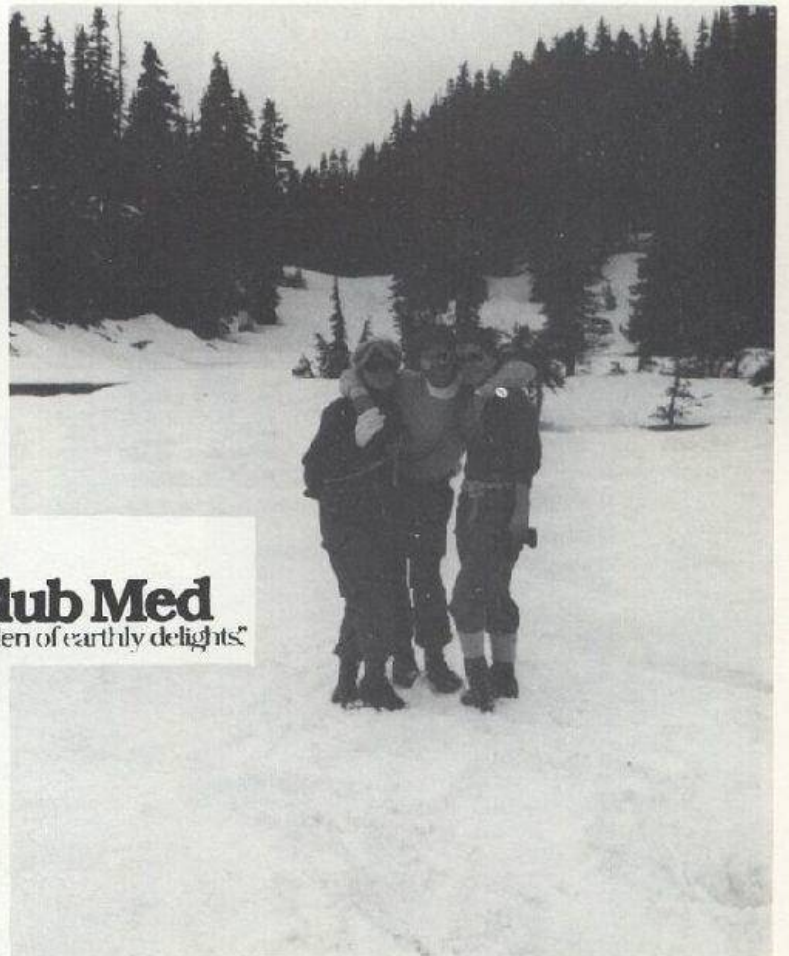
